






Spotlight Report - 5 Year Retrospective



Ontario Caregivers at a Glance



4 million across Ontario, including young caregivers

From every age group: 16-25 years – 14%, 26-45 years – 35% , 46-65 years – 36%, 65+ years – 15%

Women – 52%, Men – 46%, Non-binary – 2%

67% are employed

Who are they?



84% care for one person, usually an older family member, often a parent.



51% caring for their own parent(s) or inlaws, also raising children under the age of 18.



49%

of care recipients live with the caregiver, 37% live in other private homes, 12% live in healthcare facilities.



46%

of care recipients are 75 years or older, 18 % are between the ages of 64-75




THE CAREGIVING ROLE

- 35% invest 10+ hours of care per week
- 51% have been providing care for 2 years or more
- 76% say they are taking on more responsibilities compared to the past year and are experiencing difficulty getting things done



Increased Caregiving Responsibilities




49% say it's stressful to find services for their care recipient




Embed caregivers so they are included in care plans, at point of care.



Caregiver Well-being is at risk



73% of caregivers say they are concerned that they are not going to be able to handle all of their caregiving responsibilities going forward.





Caregivers are Balancing work and Caregiving

"Leaving my job may be the only option for me. Financially, I don't know how I'll do it, but working and taking care of my father is too hard and he's my priority right now"


40% of working caregivers say they have considered quitting their job to provide better care



Build caregiver identification and recognition across your OHT settings.



Financial Impact of Caregiving



I pay for expenses related to caregiving I have had to cut back on my or my family's to allow for caregiver expenditures **45%** of caregivers say the financial aspect of caregiving is stressful, up from 36% in 2019.

"We have done everything we were supposed to do, paid off our home, saved for what was going to be the best time of our life, now we can't do anything and I can't afford groceries." Caregiver
