They address conditions, medications, labs, procedures, and other domains and are bound to standard terminologies as recommended in USCDI. They can also be retrieved from VSAC (<https://vsac.nlm.nih.gov>) which requires registration for a free UMLS account—the easiest way to find them is to search for “Clinical Architecture” in the Steward column.
