Why? Why now?

- COVID-19 has created a once-in-a-generation focus on evidence among governments, businesses and non-governmental organizations, many types of professionals, and citizens.
- Their decisions have profoundly shaped the pandemic response and will shape responses to future societal challenges.
- While the pandemic has fast-tracked collaboration among decision-makers and researchers, drawing from a range of types of evidence to inform the full spectrum of decision-making is not yet routine.

Recognize distinct needs of different types of decision-makers

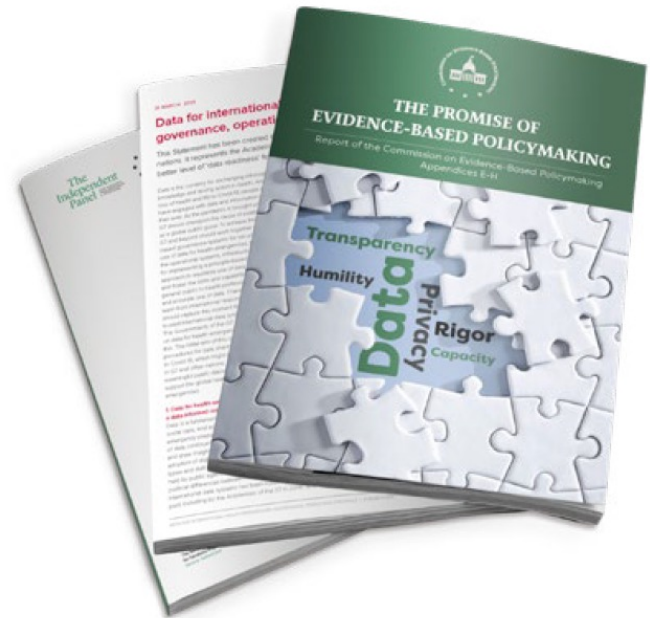

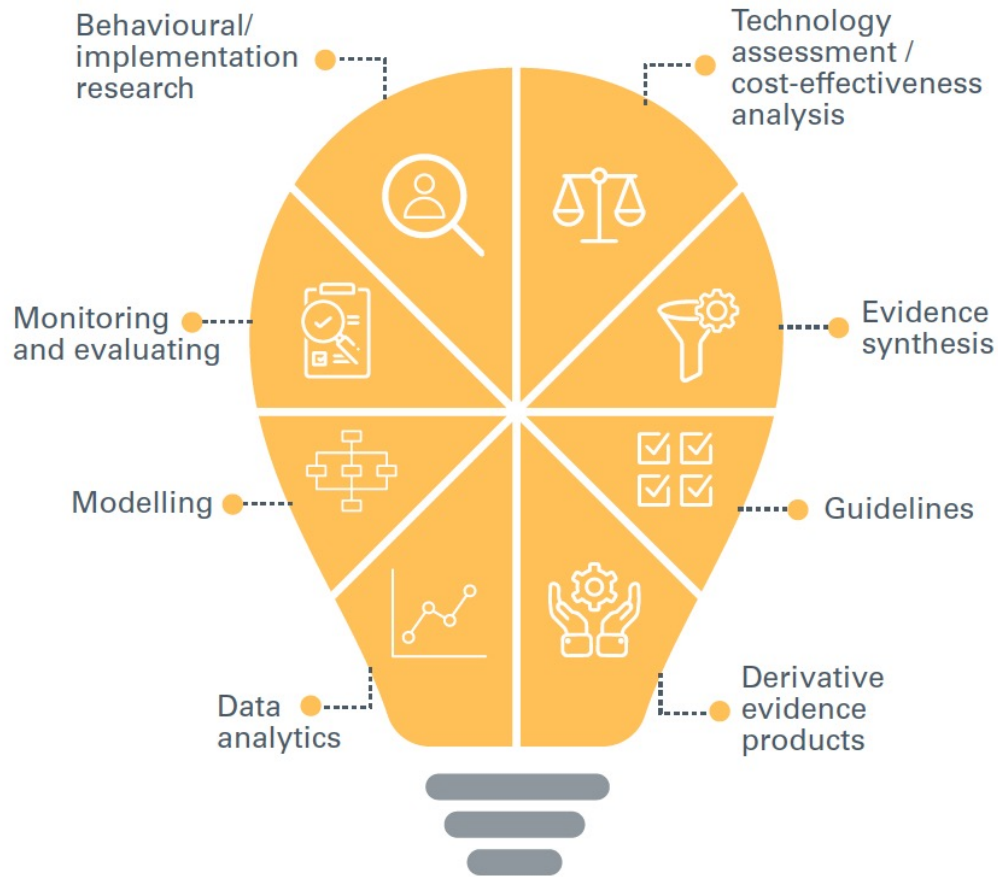

- » Domestic terrorism

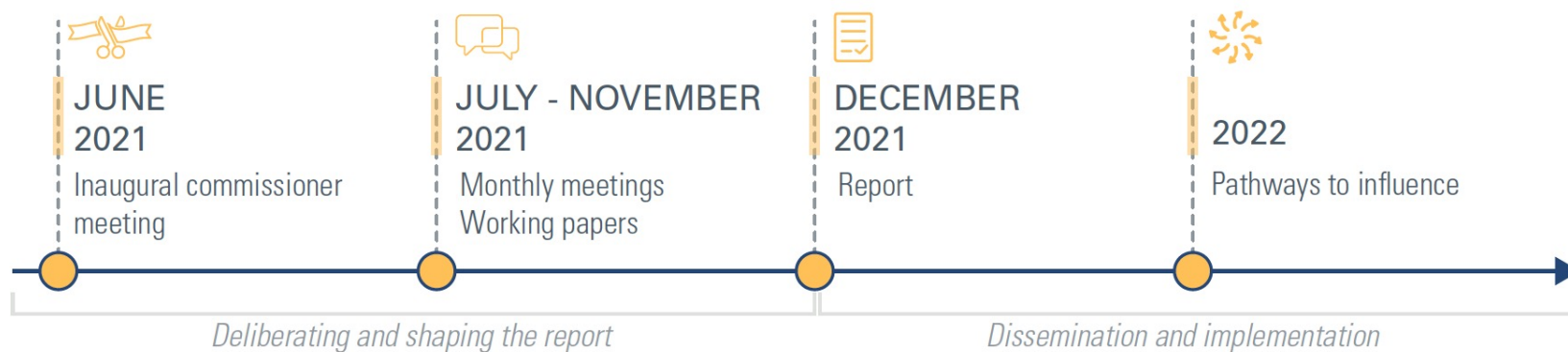
Cross-sectoral within country
