Background and set up

- Does the background provide you with enough information to understand the policy issue or question that is being asked?

2



Key messages

- Do the key messages provide a high-level understanding of what the profile/synthesis found?
- After reading the full report, do you think the key messages focus on drawing the reader's attention to the right points?

Overview and gaps (what was found)

- Are gaps in the evidence identified clearly noted?
- Are there areas within the organizing framework or in the write up that you would have expected to see evidence or a greater emphasis based on your experience/understanding with the policy area?
- Do you have questions about any of the identified evidence or its findings?

Overall language and tone

- Keeping in mind evidence syntheses are often written for a government decision-makers, do you think the language is accessible?
- Do you have suggestions that would improve the clarity of the document for the reader?

Out-of-scope feedback

- Requests to include personal experiences and subjective conclusions.
- Requests that would require making changes to the specific style guide (for example: heading levels, page layouts, bullet points, spacing, fonts, how to display data, citations, etc.) This does not include grammar and typos.
