The Essential Role of Caregivers in Improving Transitions and Addressing Alternate Level of Care

Key Messages:

1) Caregivers are an essential part of the patient care team:

Ontario's four million caregivers are critical to our healthcare system. They provide an estimated 75% of the care in the system, caring for family, friends and neighbours. When caregivers are well-supported and are included as partners in care, it can improve patient health outcomes and system performance.

Caregivers provide a critical role that supports the patients and provide essential information that can impact care.

If caregivers are not included as essential care partners

Risk and harm to Patients

- Health outcomes and quality of care
- Cognitive, mental and physical health decline
- · Increased risk of depression
- · Medication adherence may decrease
- Missed opportunities for patient history
- · Missed opportunities for preventative care
- Understanding of discharge instructions may be compromised
- Greater risk for those with linguistic/ethnocultural care needs or complex conditions
- · Risk to culturally-safe care

Risk to Healthcare System


- · Increased hospital usage:
 - Less successful transitions and risk of readmission
 - · Greater risk of ALC designation
- Missed opportunities for ALC avoidance
- Increased demands on health care workers
- · Higher system costs

2) Pro-active inclusion and support of caregivers across care settings can help reduce ALC stays:

- ✓ Caregivers know the patient
- ✓ Caregivers are key to successful transitions and increased patient safety
- ✓ Caregiver burnout is a risk factor for ALC

- ✓ Pro-active/early assessment, care planning and transitions
- ✓ Including caregivers in assessment, care planning and transitions
- ✓ Integrated approach across the system
