<b>Question</b>	<b>Response</b>
What is the purpose of the OHT Data Dashboard?	The purpose is to provide OHTs with interactive reports to understand their attributed population and assist with health system planning.
Will OHTs still receive Ministry of Health (MoH) data reports in future?	No, the OHT Data Dashboard will replace those previously provided by the MoH.
What reports will be included in the OHT Data Dashboard now and in the future?	<p>The launch of the OHT Data Dashboard includes one report. The first report, Population Overview, provides an initial look at the OHT attributed population model and a geographic overlay. A compilation of census information offers insight into the various geographic areas across Ontario (down to the dissemination area level), which will help to highlight sociodemographic and equity differences in local areas.</p> <p>Throughout the current fiscal year, nine additional reports will be released:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Hospital utilization</li><li>• Collaborative Quality Improvement Plan (cQIP) indicators</li><li>• Health conditions using the CIHI population grouping methodology</li><li>• Patient-reported outcome measures (PROMs)</li><li>• Community-based care</li><li>• Patient flow and access</li><li>• Primary care</li><li>• OHT priority topics (e.g., palliative care, mental health)</li><li>• Cost of care</li></ul>
What are the sources of the data included in these reports?	Each report leverages different datasets. All sources will be listed in the release notes within each report.
What benefits do these new reports provide?	<p>The OHT Data Dashboard Reports provide:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Improved insights about their patient population / ability to stratify population in multiple ways</li><li>• Timely data, updated regularly</li><li>• Transparency and the ability to access and learn from other OHTs data</li></ul>

How do I get access to the data?	<p>Step 1: Get registered for OneID. We can support the registration at <a href="mailto:ohtanalytics@ontariohealth.ca">ohtanalytics@ontariohealth.ca</a></p> <p>Step 2: Send your OneID account name to <a href="mailto:OHTAnalytics@ontariohealth.ca">OHTAnalytics@ontariohealth.ca</a> once registered and you will be enrolled to the report.</p>
How can I access training or support on how to use the tool?	A MS Teams channel is being created which will house job aids and videos for accessing and using the reports.

How often will the data be refreshed?	Different data sources vary on their refresh cycle. Most sources will be refreshed monthly, typically with a one month lag.
Can OHTs see each other's data?	Yes, all users have full access to the data included in these reports to enable OHT collaboration.
Can I export/print these reports?	Yes, a download tab is included in each report.
How are the indicators calculated?	Full methods will be included in each report.
Will I be able to drill down my OHTs indicator data (e.g. by forward sortation area)?	While privacy restrictions require us to suppress small cell sizes within the reports, the intent is to provide as detailed information as possible, including the ability to drill down on smaller geographies.
Can OHTs opt out if they don't wish their data to be shared?	No, providing insights into both attributed populations and local health service delivery require a comprehensive dataset.
